RMKM: The Organisation- Who We Are



Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal Sanstha (RMKM) is a voluntary organisation inspired by community Development strategies of Mahatma Gandhi which strives to improve the lives of rural people and disabled.

It all began in July 1975, when a flash flood hit the holy city of Ajmer in Rajasthan. About 250 families, many of whom were pilgrims to the famous Durgah at Ajmer were trapped in low-lying and dangerous areas. To provide relief to the distressed families, Mr. Sagar Mal Kaushik , a railway employee came forward and assisted these families by mobilizing the relief materials (food grains, clothes etc) from his neighbours.

The journey of development begun by Mr. Kaushik and group continued its forward course in the new grab i.e. being in the form of RMKM, a registered voluntary and non-profit organisation. As the name of the organisation suggests it emphasized its empathy with the most vulnerable social segment namely women. The organisation per se began its development effort in 1987.

RMKM works with the rural communities & disabled to rehabilitate them by enabling ownership over environment, institutions, and communication.

The organisation has grown in terms of population coverage, geographical areas, multidimensional and varied development intervention supported through dynamic development strategies with a focus on people living below poverty line, intellectually challenged, the women, the aged. RMKM seeks to partner with and empower the these groups to face the incongruities of their demanding home-land with the modernizing world.

RMKM operates to empower the rural population to become self-reliant against growing challenges in survival and engages in programmes which promote independence and sustainability. We give special focus to involvement of women to create gender equity in the society.

What we do: Vision, Mission & Objectives

RMKM takes a holistic approach to development

We engage the community in decision-making, planning, and implementation. These are the areas in which we work towards a more empower and equitable future:

Education and Inclusion : Rehabilitation of persons with a disability, specifically intellectually challenged in an inclusive environment. Established reach of books to rural children through library programme in Government school. Child line to help children.

Health: Prevention and education of HIV/AIDS among Female Sex Workers, out migrants, and Injecting Drugs Users, quality assured and appropriate health facilities and promotion of hygienic practices, early intervention services to intellectually challenged children, improving access and involvement in Government health services, geriatric health to aged.

Livelihood Promotion and Micro-Credit: Increased economic activities and a general increase of wealth among marginalised groups through micro-credit initiatives and goat rearing.

Human Resources Development : Foundation course for in-service teachers, two year diploma course D.Ed in Mental Retardation, training to voluntary organisation in the field of disability and inclusion.

Vision: RMKM visualizes an aware and empowered society that is capable to initiate and manage development processes aimed at sustainable development.

Mission: Empowerment of the deprived segments of society through capacity-building measures including awareness and skill building, proper interventions enhanced by applied research, all using the highest norms of social work values, ethics and principles.


Objectives: The prime objectives of RMKM is to improve the overall standard of life of the underprivileged through the mobilization of all possible resources of education, health, and environment in a lively ecosystem, namely:

- To work towards the development of the disabled through inclusive education, vocational training, prevenative and rehabilitative services;
- To reduce the rate of IMR, MMR and to curb mental disability through early intervention, health counselling and health camps;
- To excel in the field of Health Care inclusive of HIV/AIDS, Safe Motherhood, RCH and General Health;
- ♦ To empower the socially deprived, especially women, through education, awareness building, NRM, health education, capacity enhancement and micro-credit programmes;
- To provide care and support to the aged;



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OPERATIONAL AREAS



RMKM has focused its attentions primarily in Ajmer district, with some initiatives spilling into Pali district as well. The organisation's operational area comprises 97 villages in four blocks of Ajmer district and Pali district. Apart from this, RMKM also works in the urban and peri-urban areas of Ajmer, Beawar and Kekri cities.

Surrounded by the Aravalli Hills, Ajmer is the most famous of all Muslim pilgrim destinations in India, renowned for the Holy Dargah of Sufi Saint Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti as well as the Holy Lake of Pushkar.



INTERVENTION DONE IN YEAR 2012-2013

Education & Inclusion:

In its mission to support the Government of India's goal of 'Education for All', RMKM, since 1988, has addressed the needs of children with disabilities through special education, especially those with intellectual disabilities. RMKM believes that Inclusive Education is the best way for the development of both CWSN and Normal children; RMKM runs two schools:1- for both the Children with Special Needs (CWSN) and Normal



children- the Sanjay Inclusive School at Beawar; 2-Minu Manovikas Mandir Inclusive School at Chachiyawas in Ajmer. In total, RMKM has providing services to more then 550 CWSN.

RMKM is providing services through following programmes:

Pahla Kadam: A reverse Inclusive Education Model - Runs at Ajmer and Beawar 259 Normal and CWSN children got benefited in this year.

Therapeutic Support: Regular speech, physio and psycho therapy provided to needy children. Community Based Rehabilitation Programme (CBR): 275 children and their families benefited in the year.

Samarth- Residential and Respite Care Centre : Since year 2006, RMKM has been running this programme. The samarth providing services to 30 children from across the Rajasthan and from adjoining states.

Local Level Committee: RMKM act as a Member Secretary in this committee and provide legal

guardianship for the CWSN. Through this committee

Through this committee RMKM's has organized awareness programme.

Sports: RMKM has organized district level sport events for disabled. In this event 316 children an coaches have participated.


Childline: 1098 (24x7 Help Line)

SUCCESS STORY: SONU SHARMA



Sonu Sharma is a 19 years old cerebral palsy student residing in Vasundhra colony, Makrana District Nagour. Her father is die & mother is single earner.

She born with full term normal delivery and hand normal birth weight. She showed delayed development mile stone.

Her mother came to know about the school from known person. Her mother approached the school with complaint of her physical deformity, speech problem aggressive behaviors. She did not like to work with male person.

After assessment we observed that Sonu is CP mixed category child she had lack of socialization skills and irrelevant fear to male person.whensonu was admitted in school

she had balance problem and not used to work 4 step independently had least interest in doing activity and geeing along with her peer.

We have admitted Sonu is class 2 inclusion along with this regular counseling and physiotherapy is done. Counseling helped Sonu tremendously in getting along with her peers, irrelevant fear for male person totally removed. Now she walk independently.

Now, we are training in pre vocational skills like time concept and money concept skills paper folding independently now she don't need any help to do her ADL. Her mother feels that she has improved a lot.





HEALTH

RMKM's community and mental health initiative envisages generating awareness about HIV/AIDS, providing health services and support services to the aged, and improving the quality of life for the mentally challenged through early intervention, health counselling and health camps. RMKM works in the following areas under the aegis of the programme:



Aakanksha-"Aspiration" Early Identification of Special Children:

Infants and toddlers who are suspected to be at-risk or who are at-risk of delayed development in the age group of 0-6 years are provided services of early intervention. These services, provided by a multi-disciplinary team of experts. To identify special children in their early years (0-6 years) and to prevent the birth of special children, awareness programmes are organized within the community.



HIV/AIDS-IDUs, FSWs & Out Migrants:

With the financial support from Rajasthan State AIDS Control Society (RSACS), RMKM is working for the 500 Injecting Drug Users (IDUs) in Ajmer district. In this programme our main focus is to promote safe injecting practice through needle-syringe exchange programmes.

RMKM provides new disposable needles and syringes to IDUs. All IDU's are taken to the VCTC centre for HIV test every 6 months and provided ART services if found HIV positive.

RMKM is also working with 600 female sex workers (FSW) in the Pali district to promote the use of condoms for the prevention of HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) of female sex workers.



Sponsor A Grand Parent (SaGP) Programme:

With the help of Helpage India RMKM is working since 1997 for helpless elders. This year 40 destitute, 58 assisted and 45 able elderly benefited . A doctor visit in every 15 days, weakly a physiotherapist visit help them to recover from back and joint pain. We have formed 5 self help groups for elders and aware them about the benefits of saving. These groups are also connected with Lakshmi Kalash Mahila Federation, total 1lac rupees are saved by these groups. On the occasion of International Old age day on 1st Oct. 2012 food grains of Rs. 1000 are given to 30 elders and blankets are given to 50 elders. Under exposure program 12 elders has visited to NathDawara and Udaipur. On 22nd March 2012 on Holi Milan Samaroh dance, bhajan, games and other activities are organized for elders, on this occasion RMKM has provides fund of Rs. 50,000 to 5 elders for their livelihood activity and provided Goat unit to 2 elders, Hens to one elder we also funded 2 elders for their Kirana and vegetable Store.



LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION AND MICRO CREDIT

Goat-Based livelihood Enhancement Program: With support of Jamshed Ji Tata Trust, Mumbai

and technical help of The Goat trust, Lucknow Goat-Based livelihood Enhancement Program is running from August 2012 in 5 villages of Silora Block.

Pashu Sakhi (Animal Friend): Pashu Sakhi is the core essence of this program, who maintain a communication between rears of goats and organization. By the help of The Goat trust, Lucknow we have trained Pashu Sakhis so they can understand about different body parts of goat, fodder, care taking, diseases and their treatment. We have provided a Treatment-Kit to all Pashu Sakhis.



Goat Rearing Group (GRG): 5 villages in our

functional area we have build a Goat Rearing-Groups and trained all the group member.

Animal Health Camp: We have organized health camps in all 5 villages with help of Pashu Sakhi and Peravat. We have done Deworming of 705 goats and vaccination of 634 goats to decrease the chances of their death. By this program people getting aware about Pashu Sakhi's skill and our goat based livelihood enhancement program.

Family Livelihood Resource Center (FLRC) Program: With the help of ARAVALI, Aaga Kha foundation and European union we have organized many program for poorest of poor families under Family Livelihood Reference Center. We have marked 180 families in 13 villages under Piglod, Thal and Nava Gram Panchayat for FLRC activities.



♦ Community Based Saving Groups:

13 community based saving groups are created from 170 families. Before this program these families was not saving a single rupee, then they agree to save Rs. 10 per month and now they are saving at least Rs. 50-100 per month. Through this program they have realized the value of saving money and cast discrimination is also decreased.

♦ Support By Goat Unit:

5 goats are given to 10 poorest of poor with the life insurance of goat. We also trained these family for Goat rearing so that they can get maximum benefit from it. Now they have milk at their home & their children growing healthy and their expenditure on buying milk product from out side has gone down and monthly 800 to 1200 Rs. getting saved.

Micro-Finance Program:

RMKM is running a self help program for women to give strength to women socially and economically. There are 1300 women working in 123 self help groups in 35 villages from Shreenagar and Silora Block. With the help of this saving amount they can get loan on low interest rate. When there is an emergency in family women can help by this amount and this will increase importance of women in family, we have connected self help groups on village level and created a a Lakshmi Kalash Mahila Federation. These groups linked with federation so for small loans they don't need to



depend on bank. On 29 of every month meeting was organized and to informed women about different programs and to built their capacity.

Mumal Handicraft Training Centre: Since 2005, RMKM has been training rural women in different handicrafts, particularly those items already popular among the artisans of Rajasthan. By supporting, training and involving women in the production of a range of traditional and fusion products, mumal world be able to contribute to both the social and economic empowerment of the women artisans.

DAKSHA - Vocational training Centre:

For the past three years RMKM has been running DAKSHA, a vocational training centre for Children with Special Needs. Its two training centres, in Ajmer and Beawar, run five vocational units teaching deco, woodcraft, vermin composting, and stationery catering services to 32 CWSN.

Human Resource Development

. Foundation Course:

Since 2005 RMKM has engaged in conducting special education training to government and private teachers. RMKM has given training to Government and private school teachers from 8 district of Rajasthan.

Diploma in Special Education (Mental Retardation) [D.Ed . (MR)] :

According to 2001 census there are 21 million disabled people in India. Keeping this is mind in Ajmer RMKM launched the D.S.E.



(MR) course in 2007. The course is affiliated to the RCI and Ministry of Social Justice and Welfare (Govt. of India). There are 25 seats offered by RMKM per year.

Volunteer Programme:

RMKM also provides internships and volunteer opportunities for young students and youth, giving them the necessary exposure in their desired area. The vision is to promote social work and to develop interest and commitment in young people.





The Way Forward

Human Resource Development:

RMKM' vision is to create a Human Resource pool in the field of inclusive education, special education & promote NGO's to adopt the inclusive education concept widely. For this we are in the process of upgrading our D.Ed. center with B.Ed. facility. In addition to this, the organization will conduct short term training course for people already working in education. These course will help teachers understand disability and intervention in different disabilities.

Research Development:

RMKM realizes the importance of research in fast tracking the processes of development as well as assessing future demand in the development sector. The organization therefore has set up its own research wing led by professionals to develop further their model for 'Reverse Inclusion' involving work in pedagogy, curriculum, impact assessment and setting the course for the next three years. The research wing has already done considerable work in fine-tuning the model, revising the existing curriculum and entire teaching methodology.

Early Intervention Centre/Sensory Training:

- RMKM will establish a specially designed building with complete access for the disabled, especially children aged 0-6 year's.
- RMKM will develop a sensory training area for severely challenged autistic, visual impaired & children with multiple disabilities.

Women Enterprises:

RMKM wishes to establishes "Mumal- traditional craft unit" as a independent organization managed by rural women own self.


