

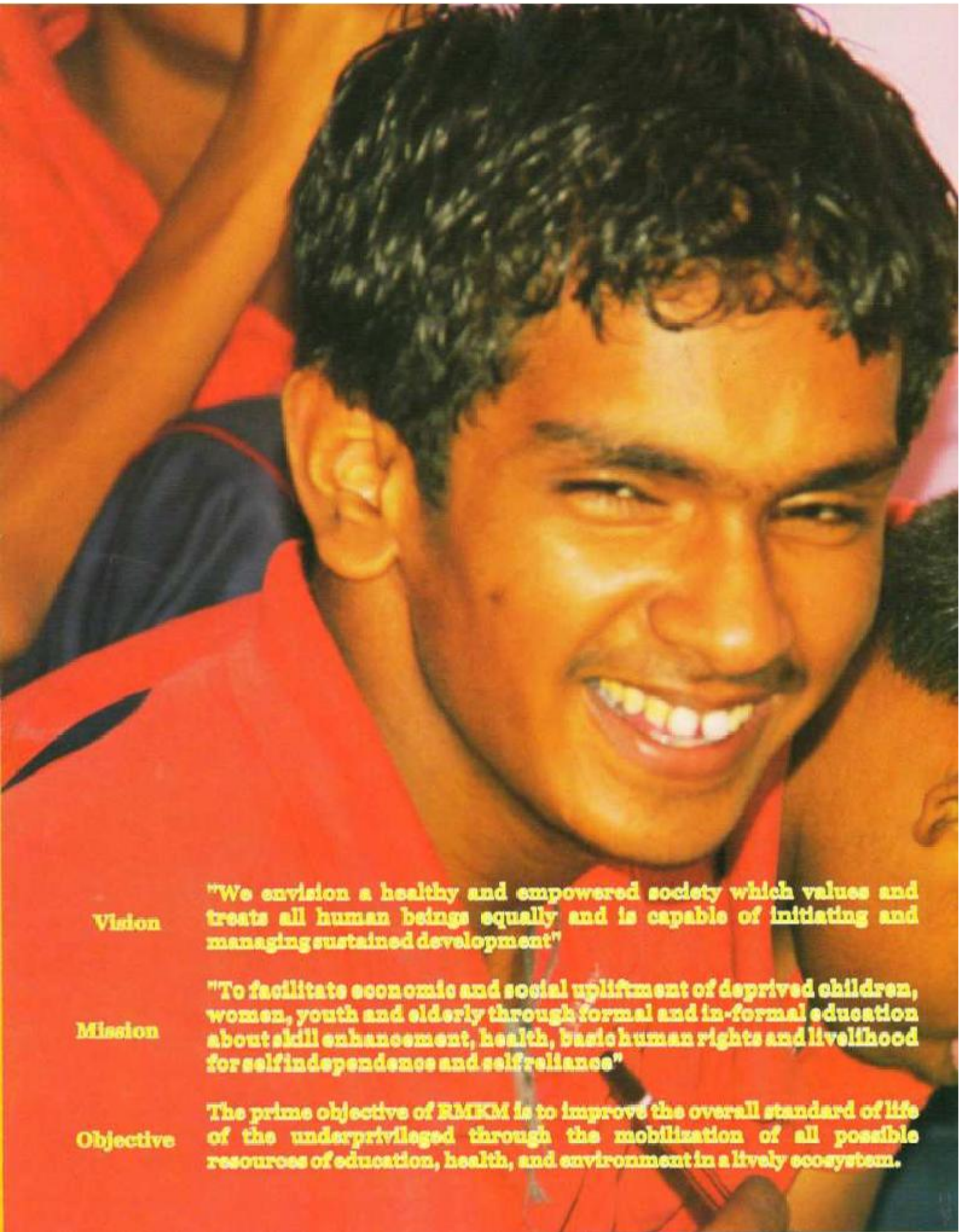

## The Stepping Stone



**Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal Sanstha (RMKM)** is a voluntary organization inspired by community development strategies of Mahatma Gandhi which strives to improve the lives of rural poor and disabled.

It all began in July 1975, when a devastating flood hit the holy city of Ajmer (Rajasthan). To provide relief to the distressed families, Mr. Sagar Mal Kaushik, railway employee came forward and assisted these families by mobilizing the relief materials (food grains, clothes etc) from his neighbors.

The journey of development begun by Mr. Kaushik and group continued its forward course in the new grab i.e. being in the form of RMKM, a registered, voluntary and non-profit organization. As the name of the organization suggests it emphasized its empathy with the most vulnerable social segment namely women. The organization began its development effort in 1987.

**Operational Area :** RMKM has focused its attentions primarily in Ajmer district, with some initiatives in Pali, Bikaner, Jodhpur, Nagaur & Tonk, Chittorgarh districts as well. The organization's operational area comprises 97 villages in four blocks of Ajmer district and Pali district. RMKM also works in the urban and sub-urban areas of city Ajmer, Beawar and Kekri.

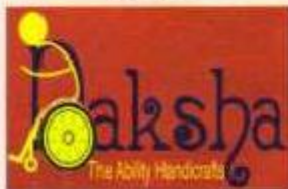

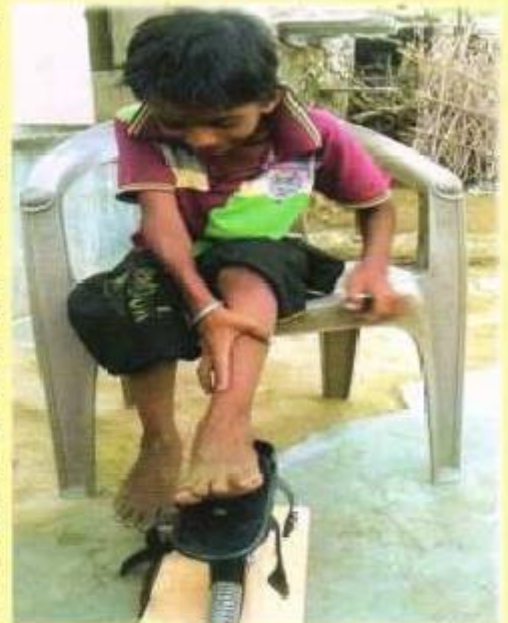

## Voices of Change

### Towards Independence and Inclusion

Mickey, a 9 years old boy having Cerebral Palsy, He was born on 12 May, 2008 at Ajmer. He is residing in Kayad village, Ajmer, with his parents, two younger sisters and one younger brother. His Father is a Labourer and Mother works in NAREGA, his siblings are studying in private school in their Village. He belongs to a lower middle class family. His parents were very depressed with the condition of their son, they took him to many doctors but couldn't find a cure for him, but they didn't lose hope. As it is said where



there is a hope there is a way, so they also found the way for Mickey when CBR worker from Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal Sanstha (RMKM) visited them through Anganwadi Worker, explained Mickey's family what he is facing & how he can be helped. On 10 April, 2014 his assessment was done by the Psychologist of RMKM, during the assessment, it was observed that he need Physiotherapy also having speech problem, behavior problems, according to the assessment he was found appropriate for pre primary level. From then CBR programme was started being given to him, CBR worker started working on his Personal, Social, Educational, Vocational & Recreational level. His family has been very cooperative & had followed every instruction given by CBR worker towards Mickey's development, Mickey has also cooperated his teacher. He had fallen many times while walking but he never stopped trying. Now it's been 3 years since CBR programme is being given to him, a good change is being observed. There is development in his Education level, he goes to private school which is in their village as well as there is development in his personal level he has adopted good behavior as taught by CBR worker. There is lot of improvement in his speech, earlier it was not clear but now he speaks clearly and without any error. Looking at him it can't be said that he is the same boy. There is a lot of development in him in a very short period. He has started walking without anyone's support, earlier he needed support to walk. He plays with his friends and Siblings without any fear of falling or getting hurt. His family is very happy with his development and also thankful to RMKM for their efforts.

## Ready to Roll

There is no doubt about the saying that "we need to have a balance for a happier life". Still it is not an easy task for all of us. Living life with hurdles and hindrances and more over moving ahead with a balance is an art. We learn this art of living from our special students who never back down seeing the challenges ahead.

Balancing life on wheels and rolling through the disability is the achievement made by Monica Bagadi. Monica is 13 years disabled student of Minu Manovikash Mandir Inclusive School, Chahiyawas Ajmer. She has multiple disabilities, which are mental retardation, speech problem, low concentration and low attention. Her parents did not lose hope and started searching for a school where their daughter could feel comfortable. The will of her parents to get her daughter educated found its way to Minu School when they got in contact with one of our CBR worker and she joined the school.



Preparation for the Olympics

With the object to improve the overall standard of living of the underprivileged, a vision to make Monica roll over her disabilities was foreseen by the Chief Functionary of the organization. Ms. Kshama R. Kaushik, showed confidence in Monica that she will defiantly shine out brightly under the roller skating segment of Special Olympics and other National Championships. With the confidence and support by RMKM she started participating in the divisional level sports activities. Monica made us and her parents proud by winning a gold medal in zigzag skating and silver medal in straight

skating at National Championship, Bariely (U.P.) Today she not only skate herself but, also has started training other students to skate their dreams out.

Her father was overwhelmed by such great achievement of his daughter. He said- "I cannot express by happiness seeing my daughter holding that gold medal which she earned out of her capabilities. I am no longer worried about the fact, that my daughter is deprived of few qualities, instead, I am proud of her that she showed the spirit of winning in such a sport in which many normal students are unable to perform well."

## Bal Sansad (Child Parliament)

**It is all similar to running a nation, albeit, on a smaller canvas.**

Bal Sansad or Children Parliament is a novel way to teach children about the democratic process. Led by a President, the Bal Sansad of Minu School and Sanjay School Beawar has a Prime Minister and a bunch of MPs. Portfolios include sports, water, food, cleanliness, hostel and suggestion. Elections are held for the office bearers of the Bal Sansad under 3 parties which are- Pani Bachao (Save Water), Prithvi Bachao (Save Earth) and Humara Jeevan (Our Life) according to the secret ballot process.



From amongst the elected office bearers the students select a President and a Prime Minister.

The Bal Sansad isn't just about role-playing; the members take their job seriously. Each member of the Bal Sansad has their tasks cut out. They ensure that both children and teachers turn up for school, the children maintain cleanliness, the campus is tidy, toilets are in working condition (as much as possible), the students are able to read in a comfortable environment, the water provided is available every time and is clean and safe, that the school doesn't run out of sports supplies and any other requirement of student is considered by the members.

Both the day care centers are working on inclusion, hence, the members of the Bal Sansad are both CWSN (Children with special needs) and non-disabled. The Bal Sansad works for the betterment of both, CWSN and non-disabled students. In their monthly meeting they discuss on the matters related to skill development, health and hygiene, problem solution and increase in awareness of the students.

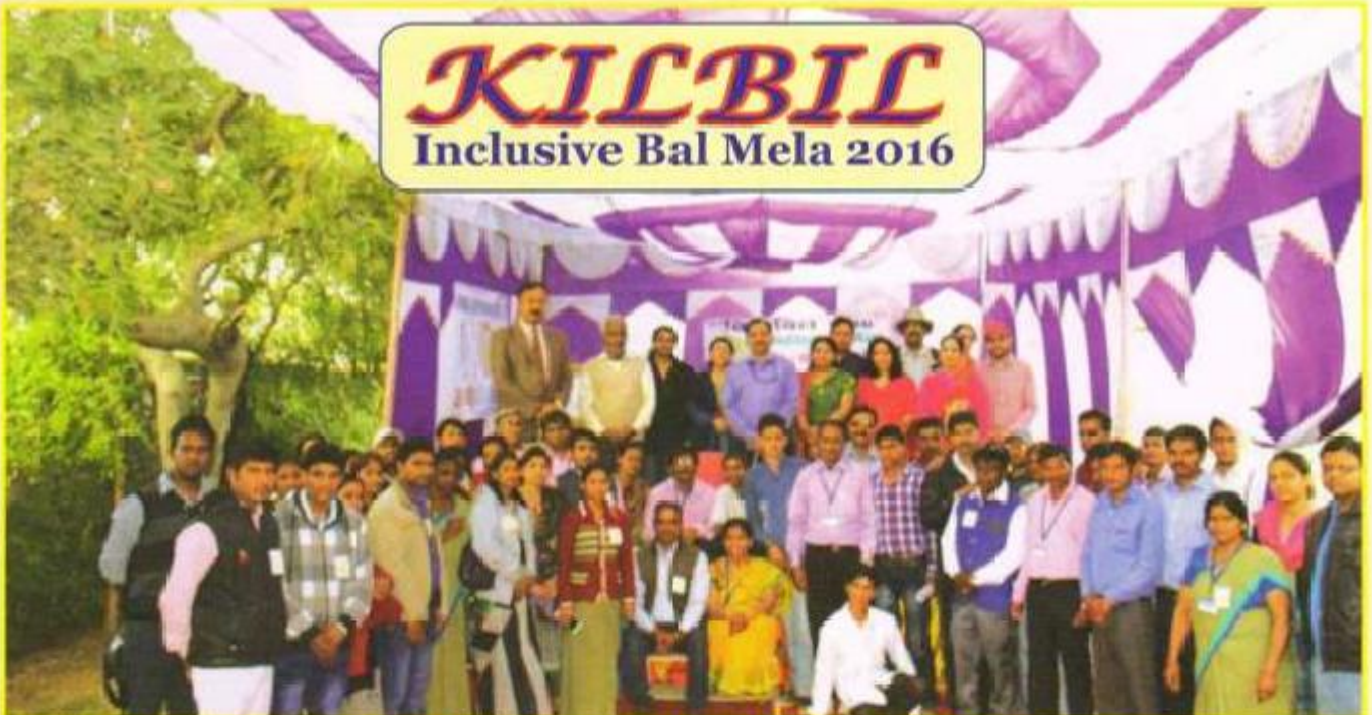
The process of decision making starts either with basic level observation or through Gyana Baba. Gyana Baba (a puppet) is an initiative took by the Prime Minister of Bal Sansad through which all the students can write their problems anonymously and Bal Sansad will discuss on the same in the next monthly meeting.

Water is one of the essential element for living. At Minu School, in earlier days there was a problem of water supply. The staff had to lift campers from one department to the other because of which sometime the water was not delivered on time or the workers had difficulty in lifting the filled campers. Observing the problem, the water minister suggested to develop a pipe line. The Bal Sansad along with senior teachers discussed on the problem. After continues efforts and follow up there was a direct connection provided in the campus of Minu School. In order to provide clean and safe water, a water purifier was installed. With this, the water was directly supplied in the water cooler and the students and teacher can easily have access to it anytime. The decision was took in consultation with the hostel minister, as the hostlers were also in need of a direct connection of water.

Organizing cricket matches in the campus, plantation of new trees, cleanliness of school premises, sports and school uniform, etc. are some of the important decisions too by Bal Sansad.

# Ability Fashion Walk



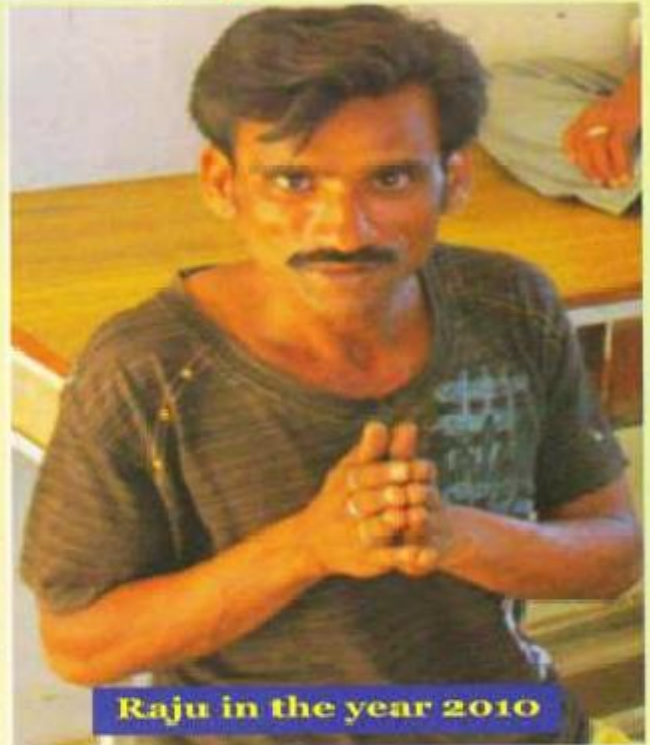

## Health

### Give Hugs, Not Drugs

Raju, a 40 years old adult was registered with the Target Intervention (TI) Program for Injective Drug Users, managed of the organization from the year 2009. He lives at Andarkot (village in Ajmer district) where he took injective drug, smack, from last 7 years. On an average, he injected the drug about 4 times in a day that made 120 times in a month. There have been times when he took a dose of drugs without eating anything or in a semi-cautious state, which led to injuries caused because of wrong injection of needle. He was mostly found in an un-cautious state, his family had his where about and was worried because of his addition of drugs.

At the TI Program the registered members are counseled about the risk that are associated with using injections as a source of taking drugs, clinical services that are required and in a period of three months a complete medical checkup was done and the members are counseled so as to encourage them to reduce the dose of drugs they take.

After he joined the program, he took the services provided on regular basis and with this it was observed that Raju is safe from Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). He live in an area where the availability of drugs is very easy, still with regular interventions he had reduced its intake. Today, because of these regular interventions he had completely stopped taking drugs and works in a garments shop in the village itself from last one year because of which he is now able to earn his living properly. After observing such improvement in him, Raju said, "I was someone who had nothing to do with the household or living because of drugs, because of this habit I was not able to concentrate on the needs of the family also and made them upset with my condition. I and my family is thank full to the TI program that made us aware about the danger associated with this habit of injective drugs. The counseling and complete knowledge made me a better man and capable of earning a better livelihood.



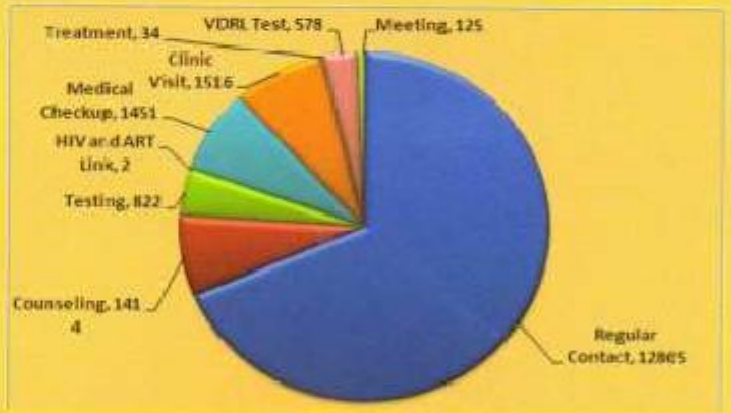
## HIV AIDS-IDUs, FSWs & Migrants :

With the financial support of Rajasthan State AIDS Control Society (RSACS), RMKM is working for the 553 Injecting Drug Users (IDUs) in Ajmer district. In this programme the main focus is to promote safe injecting practice through needle-syringe exchange programmes. RMKM is also working with 600 female sex workers (FSW) in the Pali district to promote the use of condoms for the prevention of HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) of female sex workers. RMKM is also working at Ajmer for Transit Intervention. In this program we have covered approx 10,000 migrants.

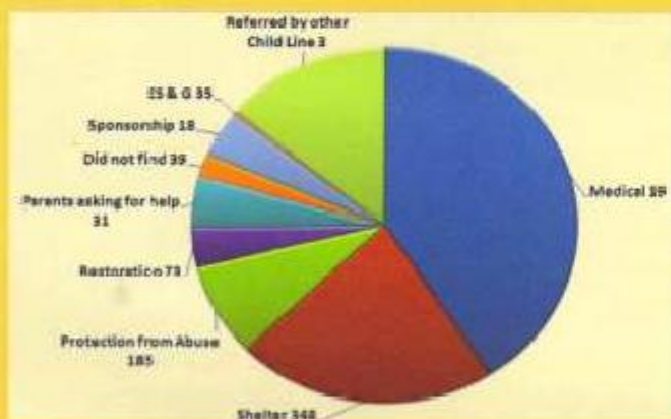

## The Magical Shelter

***"I'll be your blanket, baby. Wrap yourself up in me. Let me give you shelter, in the winter of this world."***

Who knows where life is planning to lead us, who knows what is the next move, who knows who will help us, who knows who will give us shelter. Knowing the fact, that life is full of uncertainties our child line workers are ready for the upright challenges each day at a single call. We feel privileged to have a team who is ready to provide every help possible to the child any time needed. Instancing a case of the efforts made by the Child Line team for the betterment of children,



On a cold evening of December our child line worker received a call from a co-worker in Delhi that a lady named Kiran (name changed) has been admitted to the Jawahar Lal Nehru Hospital, Ajmer in the casualty ward. Kiran was a nomadic who came to Ajmer in search of some work and had no contact with her family. She met with a sever accident on that same day. Help from child line was asked for the child, Sukhbir (name changed) with Kiran who needed a caretaker until the time his mother recovers from the injury. Immediately after the call, two of the child line workers made a move to the hospital where Kiran was admitted. There they inquired about the woman and after completing the formalities visited her. She being in an unconscious state was not able to look after her son, who was worried about the condition and situation present. Our workers tried to talk to the child and know about his where about, he being scared and young was not able to answer anything properly. They tried to take the child with them but, he was not willing to leave his mother at all.

After a follow call by the worker to Kiran's doctor, it came to their notice that "Kiran's condition is not showing any improvement, instead has deteriorated than the previous day. Her son is still not ready to leave his mother and sitting next to her holding her finger. He urgently needs a shelter as there are very less chances of Kiran to recover". Our workers reached to the hospital after getting this information. They tried and waited for Sukhbir to come with them but nothing fruitful happened. The next day Kiran's doctor called and informed that Kiran is no more. The child needs to be taken from here. Sukhbir was taken into the custody of our workers as soon as they came to know about the mishap. He was then taken to G.R.P. Police Station where a report of missing child was registered and then he was brought to the child line center. Considering the mental status of the child, the workers tried to comfort him and ask about his other family members, but he was unable to give any proper information.

The workers then approached Ms. Tanuja Jha (member of child welfare committee) with Sukhbir and was asked what could be done for the benefit of the boy. The Child Line workers were guided to enroll the boy to the crech at Lohagal Village. The next day the workers were informed by the hospital authorities that they need to bring the child for the funeral of his mother and the same was done by them.

It is said that ***"Love of the Family is that magical shelter where you will feel safe beneath it"***. In the month of January, 4-year boy was showered with love and affection of a family who approached the creche and for adoption. After complete background check and formalities, the child was handed over to the new family. Sukhbir got the love of the family and is happily living with his new family.

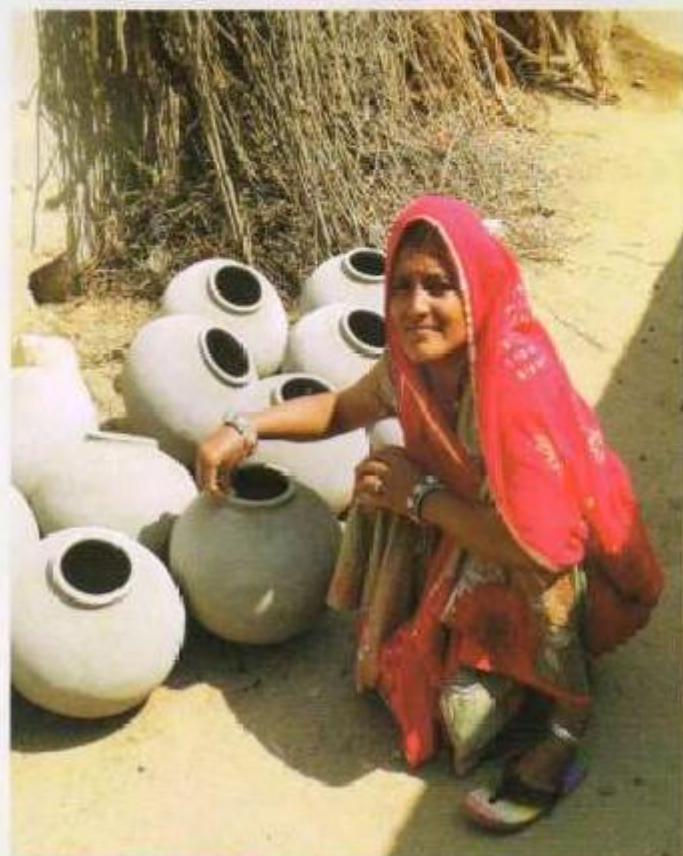
## Livelihood Promotion And Micro Credit

### Goat-Based livelihood Enhancement

**Program :** The program is being implemented with the support of Give India Foundation as they helped in providing 13 goats to poor families this year. Few highlights of the program are as follows :

**Pashu Sakhi (Animal Friend) :** Pashu Sakhi is the core essence of this program, who maintain a communication between rears of goats and organization. With the help of The Goat trust, Lucknow we have trained Pashu Sakhis so they can understand about different body parts of goat, fodder, care taking, diseases and their treatment. We have provided a Treatment-Kit to all Pashu Sakhis.

**Goat Rears Groups (GRG):** Various GRG are formed and animal health camps are organized under this program.



**Micro- Finance Program :** RMKM is running a self help program for women to give strength to women socially and economically. There are 2105 women working in 200 self help groups.

**Total Saving = 1,27,33,500.00**

**Internal Loan = 2,054,7,325.00**

**Bank Loan = 3,52,00000.00**

We have connected self help groups on village level and created a **Lakshmi Kalash Mahila Manch**. These groups are linked with federation so for small loans they don't need to depend on bank. Meeting is organized every month and women are informed about different program to build their capacity.



#### **Mumal Handicraft Training Center :**

Since 2005, RMKM has been training rural women in different handicrafts, particularly those items already popular among the artisans of Rajasthan. By supporting, training and involving women in the production of a range of traditional and fusion products, Mumal is able to contribute to both the social and economic empowerment of the women artisans.

#### **Laxmi Kalash Mahila Manch :**

We have registered our federation in trust act. Now this federation is working as independent organization.

## Human Resource Development

### (I) Foundation Course :

Since 2005 RMKM has itself in conducting special education training to government and private teachers. Training to Government and private school teachers from 8 district of Rajasthan.

RMKM realises that in order to make their efforts at holistic community building a sustainable and widespread

activity and achieve the desired results, there is urgent requirement of trained human resources. The organisation has therefore invested in several capacity building initiatives under the roof of "Sagar College"



**(II) Bachelors Degree in Special Education (Mental Retardation) B.Ed. SE-MR and Diploma in Special Education (Mental Retardation) - DSE (MR):** By keeping in the view the capacity of Special Educators/Professionals working in the field of disability, RMKM started the DSE (MR) course in 2007, the only organisation in Ajmer district to do so. The course is affiliated from the Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi (RCI) and Ministry of Social Justice and Welfare (Govt of India). There are 30 seats offered by RMKM for this programme.



While RMKM has the required expertise by way of a trained and experienced faculty, its school for special children provides the necessary practical experience for students of the course. The scope of the course is immense since according to the state government, there should be one teacher for every eight MR students and one special instructor for every block in a district under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) guidelines.



With the successful implementation of DSE (MR) course, RMKM started the Degree course in Special Education (Mental Retardation) B.Ed S.E.-M.R in the year 2015. The course has been affiliated with Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi (RCI) and Recognized by Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University (MDSU), Ajmer. The course offers 30 seats for the candidates who aspires to work in the field of special education.



# 1<sup>st</sup> Alumni Meet 29<sup>th</sup> Dec. 2016



29<sup>th</sup> December 2016 was the joyful day for organization when Alumni Meet 2016 was organized by Sagar College (managed by Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal Sanstha) for the Former Students of our educational course in Special Education D. Ed. SE (MR). This was the First Alumni Meet being organized in the field of Special Education in Rajasthan State where all passed out chunk from the year 2007 to year 2015 have participated, cherished their old memories and happily assured one another that this meet& conversation will continue in future.

## Towards the Development

It is wisely said by Sir Ken Robinson (British Author) that "Human resources are like natural resources; they're rightly buried deep. You have to go looking for them, they're not just lying around on the surface. You have to create the circumstances where they show themselves." At RMKM we have stepped on the stone towards the search of such resources and develop them to provide special education. For this, complete development by the way of a professional course **Special D.Ed. (Mental Retardation)** for two years is provided in which the students who had completed their graduation are trained in the field of special education. The course is managed by **Sagar College, Ajmer**.



In the process of providing the society with a developed resource in the area of special education, a student Dharamichand Meghwanshi, has stood out of the crowd with different ideas. Dharamichand belongs to a joint family where there are nine members including himself. The family falls under the BPL (Below Poverty Line) category. Amongst the nine members, only Dharmichand is educated. His parents had a dream that Dharmichand should get all the education

he need to serve the society and help the ones with need. They somehow managed to pay the fee for his graduation. To live up the dreams of his parents he took admission in the Special D. Ed. (Mental Retardation) course at Sagar College in the year 2014.

He was then, taught and trained towards the understanding of various disabilities and ways to work with the person disable. 

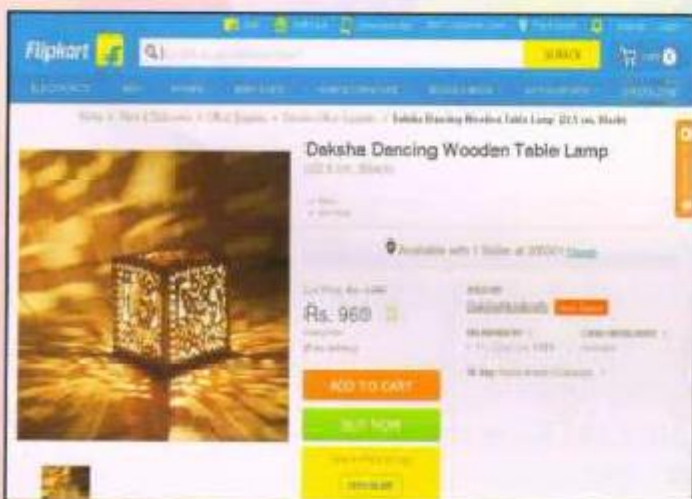
