About Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal

'There's something good in every bad situation'

That's exactly what happened in July 1975, when flash floods hit the holy city of Ajmer in Rajasthan. About 250 families, many of whom were pilgrims to the famous Dargah at Ajmer, were trapped in low-lying and dangerous areas. Late Mr. Sagar Mal Kaushik, a railway employee, sprang into action to mobilize relief materials like food grains and clothes, to affected families.

This situation had given birth to a new movement. A journey of development had begun! Mr. Kaushik and his group continued forward by formalizing their work as 'Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal (RMKM)', a registered voluntary and non-profit organization. As the name suggests, RMKM aimed to work for the most vulnerable social segment – women. The organization per se began its development effort in 1987.

RMKM's work is inspired by community development strategies of Mahatma Gandhi. RMKM works with rural communities and disabled to rehabilitate them by enabling ownership over environment, institutions and communication. The organization has evolved over the years – in terms of population coverage, geographical areas, multidimensional and varied development intervention supported through dynamic development strategies with a focus on people living below poverty line, intellectually challenged, the women, the aged. RMKM strives to partner with and empower these groups to face the incongruities of their demanding home-land with the modernizing world.

In an endeavour to empower the rural population to become self-reliant against growing challenges in survival, RMKM engages in programmes that promote independence and sustainability. All our efforts ensure involvement of women with an objective to create gender neutral society.

We envision a healthy and empowered society which values and treats all human beings equally and is capable of initiating and managing sustained development

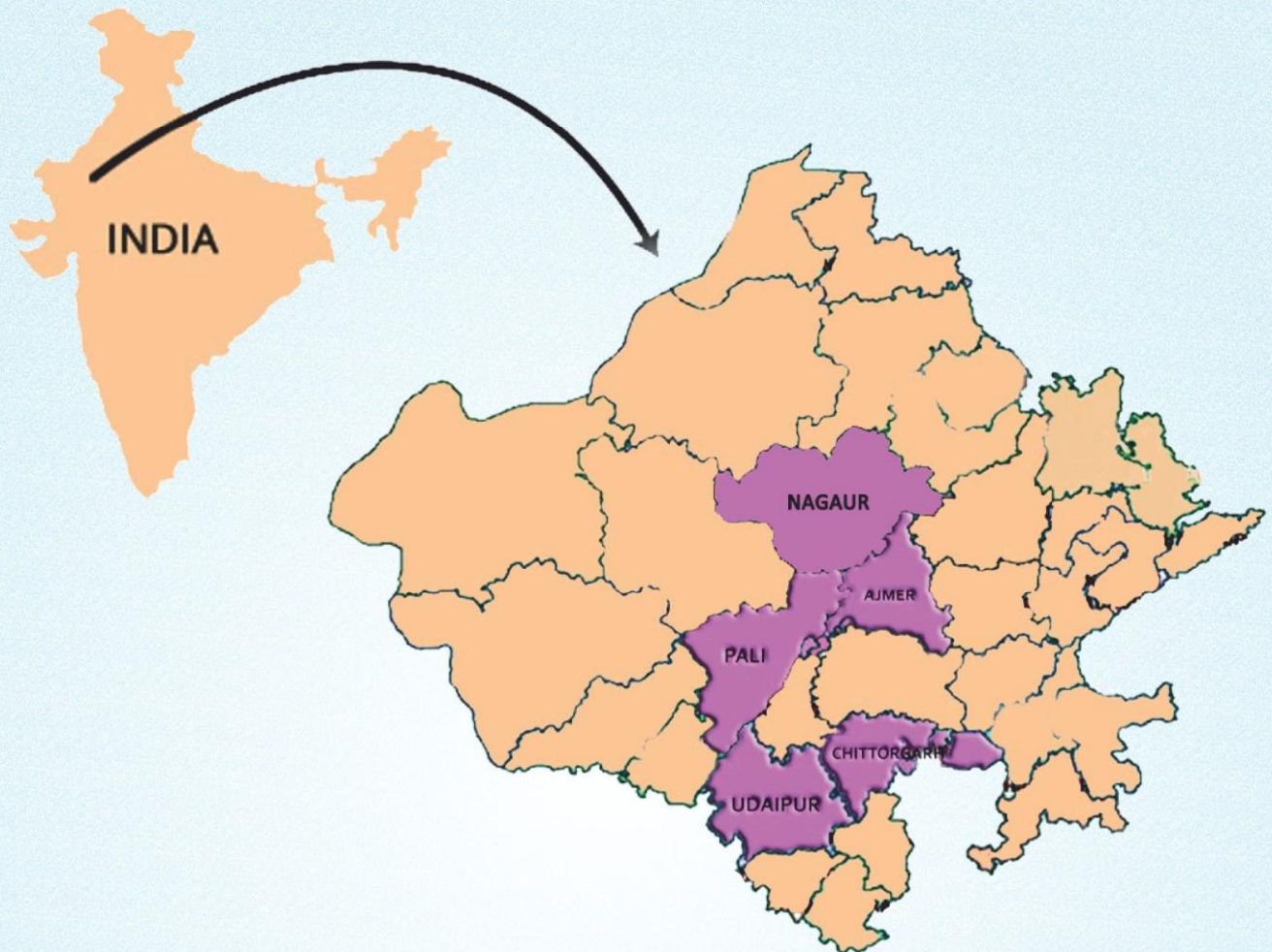

RMKM's reach



Surrounded by the Aravalli Hills, Ajmer is located just 14 kms from the pilgrimage town of Pushkar which is well-known as tirtha-raj (King of pilgrim sites) having an only temple of Lord Brahma and is also famous for the holy Pushkar Lake resounds with the chants and hymns from the various temples located on its banks. Pushkar is one of the most famous tourist destinations among Indian as well as international tourists.

Home to a number of tourist places, Ajmer is a perfect blend of the diversity of the Indian culture and ethics, and displays a perfect blend of religion, community, culture, etc., coexisting and flourishing in harmony. Ajmer's most famous and most-visited landmark - The Ajmer Sharif Dargah is considered to be among the holiest Muslim shrines in India as Khwaja Moin-ud-din Chishti, the Sufi saint enshrined here, keeping its doors open to all faiths and religions.

RMKM has focussed its attentions primarily in Ajmer, Pali, Udaipur & Chittorgarh district, with some initiatives spilling into Nagaur district as well. The organisation's operational area comprises 250 villages of these districts. Apart from this, RMKM also works in the urban and peri-urban areas of Ajmer, Beawar and Pushkar cities.

It gives me immense pleasure to bring to you our Annual Report for 2019-20. 2020 was our 45th year of operations and with each passing year, our endeavour to make lives of the community we serve better, only strengthens more.

I would like to extend my profound gratitude to Board members of RMKM, Staff, various government bodies, well-wishers and most importantly – the community we serve – for bestowing their faith on us and offering us consistent support.

RMKM continues to work on its endeavour of promoting productivity, inclusive growth, self-reliance, and welfare of the rural poor and Persons with Disability (PWDs) in Ajmer region. We started our financial year with understanding of regional demands and tried to develop better eco-system for our beneficiaries. 2020 witnessed major focus on providing community placements to PWDs through Gardening & Housekeeping training. In addition, we extended our Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) – Program in Silora Block which helped us to reach the unreached rural PWDs. Over 1500 PWDs were linked to various social security schemes through our various programmes.

Along with this, under micro finance and livelihood program, we provided bank loan of Rs 9.71 crores to rural woman with the support of ICICI Bank & Rang de. Our 24x7 child line collab. attended 2984 calls, 885 case interventions and has established excellent linkages with concerned departments like police, labour department, Child Welfare Committee (CWC), District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) etc. for providing best services to children in distress. With our interventions, we were able to support 933 Female Sex Workers (FSW) and 600 Intra Drug Users (IDUs) in protection with HIV/Aids.

As we move forward, we seek your continued support and guidance! We will be more than happy to hear your suggestions, new ideas and feedback on our work!

Also accredited with prestigious GuideStar India Advanced Level- Gold certification and PLATINUM (5 Star) Accreditation by Financial Management Service Foundation - FMSF which symbolizes contribution to the community services and excellence in Financial management, Governance and Legal compliances. RMKM, since the establishment in 1975, has been working in the field of community development and various underprivileged areas in unprecedented ways, against unimaginable odds; on very low resources, in very remote places to serve our beneficiaries. It is the result of nearly 45 years of constant learning and innovating in a place of scarcity or adversity, that has given us the resilience we are heavily relying on at present. With the continuous support of funding partners and supporters, we have been able to extend rehabilitation services and trained professionals to reach around 5000 Persons with Disability (PWDs) in the remote areas of Rajasthan. We have been the first organization in North India to adopt “Reverse inclusion” an integrated model of Inclusive Education, vocational training, economic empowerment, sustainable livelihood and inclusion of mainstream society that provides PWDs -a dignified and independent life. With an aim to empower and provide sustainable livelihood opportunities to women fraternity, we work with over 300 Self Help Group – SHGs of deprived rural poor women in Rajasthan.

About Rajasthan, it is always defined as a state with cultural diversities, low education level, poor connectivity and infrastructure, slow economic growth and resource scarcity, make this part of the country even more vulnerable. The journey thus far has been a challenging with various ups and downs. However, our resilience and conviction to accomplish our mission grew stronger with every passing day.

Education

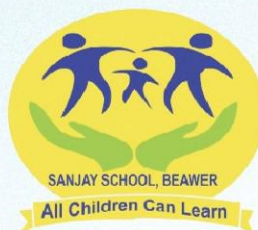
In its endeavour to support the Government of India's goal of 'Education for All', RMKM, since 1988, has addressed the needs of children with disabilities through special education, especially those with intellectual disabilities. RMKM believes that Inclusive Education is the best way for the development of both Children with Special Needs (CWSN) and non-disabled children.

RMKM runs two inclusive schools for CWSN and non-disabled children, namely, Sanjay Inclusive School at Beawar and Minu Manovikas Mandir Inclusive School at Chachiyawas in Ajmer. Moreover, it also runs Day Care Centres, Early Intervention Centres, Community Based Rehabilitation & Vocational Training Centres in Ajmer district.

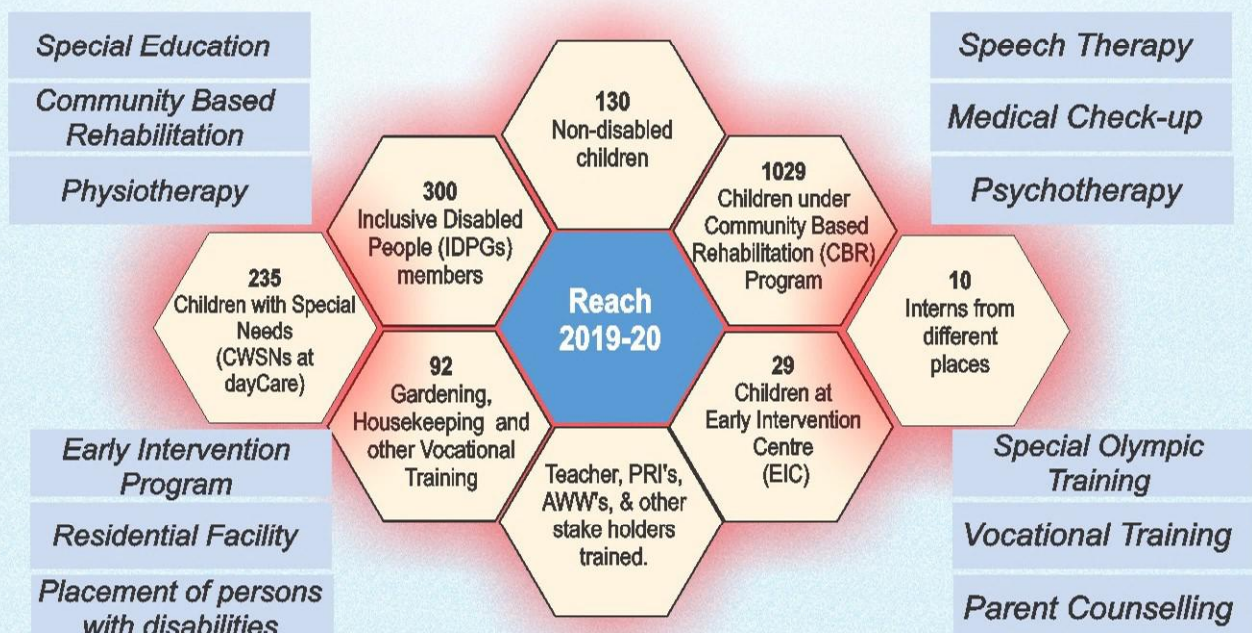

“Umer is a Person with ability to defeat weaknesses”

Mohammed Umer is 18 years old having Intellectual Development Delay with Cerebral palsy. At the time, when we started intervention with him on 31.10.2011, he was just able to speak only “Mummy-Papa”, could sit & eat food and was able to identify his family members. He was familiar with his surroundings but did not have grip on the things. Everyone knows there are lack of services in rural areas, but with the support of our partners and stake-holders, organization has been able to provide professional expertise at their doorstep to unreached population. Our CBR worker started working for Umer’s development on various fronts and also counseled his parents to increase his participation in all societal functions for his social development. He was given a training by CBR worker on various key areas viz. education social, personal, recreational as well. As he had problem in speech and could not walk, so he was given regular therapeutic intervention in Physiotherapy & Speech therapy. His overall development is a result of joint involvement of CBR workers and his parents specially father who always motivated him to learn. After all these efforts, now he recognizes the currency notes, hold things well, greets happily others and is now much interactive than before. He can now walk with the support & capable of defeating his weaknesses with his capacities of learning & working hard to accomplish any task given in proper guidance of the CBR worker. Though life was not easier for him, he has to face sudden demise of his father in January 2018, who was his great supporter, but he gathered & pushed himself become more responsible & stronger with the support of his family as well as CBR Workers. Consequently, today he is running the general store of his father with support of his mother. Seeing the developments in Umer, his Mother always express heartfelt thanks to RMKM that they reached to them because they had never expected such services continuously will receive for their son.

Reaching to unreached children with disability and to provide quality therapeutic services and special education at the door steps is the prime motto of RMKM, which is leading to independent living within the society.

Programmes



Community & Mental Health

Ajmer and Pali has a significant part of vulnerable population susceptible to HIV/AIDS, including female sex workers, out-migrants and substance abusers. RMKM's community and mental health programs include interventions in the areas of generating awareness about HIV/AIDS, providing health services, health counselling and health camps.

RMKM runs two inclusive schools for CWSN and non-disabled children, namely, Sanjay Inclusive School at Beawar and Minu Manovikas Mandir Inclusive School at Chachiyawas in Ajmer. Moreover, it also runs Day Care Centres, Early Intervention Centres, Community Based Rehabilitation & Vocational Training Centres in Ajmer district.

HIV/AIDS-Intra Drug Users (IDUs), Female Sex Workers (FSWs) & Migrants

- **IDU** - Generate awareness about HIV/AIDS, providing health services, and improve the quality of life for IDUs through early intervention, health counselling and health camps.
- Promote safe injecting practice through needle-syringe exchange programmes. Provide new disposable needles and syringes to IDUs.
- **FSW** - Promote use of condoms for the prevention of HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI)
- Counselling to in and out migrants about prevention of HIV/AIDS

“Suresh is now progressing to achieving life goals.”

Suresh (name changed) is a resident of Lakhna Kotri, Ajmer. Earlier, he used to work at the restaurant to support his father in the livelihood of his family and used to meet different people due to work, thus he got in touch with the key-person of IDU who told Suresh that alcohol is nothing against the drugs taken through injections, it lasts longer. At first, Suresh refused, but he also had a habit of drinking so when later, he saw that person getting intoxicated with injections, that made him feel like it too and he also got the injection on his hands for the first time. He enjoyed more than alcohol, also got used to it slowly and lost his work. He started ignoring the responsibility of the family, his father expelled him out of the house and could hardly maintain the household expenses. One day, he met peer of Target Intervention centre, who brought him to the office of RMKM, made him meet the counselor and outreach worker here, they informed him about safe injecting and the Drop In Centre (DIC). Then he started coming to the DIC daily, his behavior reflected positive changes and his habit of intoxication also started decreasing. Due to which, he became able to bring his life back on track, started running a tempo to support the family. Suresh expressed his gratitude towards RMKM that he is living a good life.

Livelihood Promotion

“Empower the socially deprived, especially women, through education, awareness building, natural resource management, health education, capacity building and microcredit programmes.”

Goat-Based livelihood Enhancement Program

RMKM launched the Goat based Livelihood Enhancement Program in August 2012 in 5 villages from Silora block, with an objective to provide additional scope of livelihood for people below poverty line. The project mainly aimed at empowering women, through below focused interventions, with support of our knowledge partner, The Goat trust, Lucknow.

Goat Rearing Group (GRG): With an objective to enhance goat rearing practices, we have formed Goat Rearing Groups in 5 villages of Silora block. Each group member has been trained in the area and a monthly meeting is organized of every group in which factors like de-worming, protection schemes, goat induction, Pashu Sakhi etc. are discussed.

This intervention has benefited 600 goat rearers

Micro - Finance Program

Women self-help groups (SHGs) have been formed in 42 villages from Shree-nagar, Jawaja and Silora blocks with an objective to strengthen village women socially and economically. The SHGs are also connected on village level to Lakshmi Kalash Mahila Federation for small loans.

Under this program, **2,377 women members** are linked to 200 SHGs. Also 69 beneficiaries served through Loan by RangDe, Bangalore.

“Nathi Devi has become an owner of fancy store.”

Nathi Devi w/o Shri Laxman Ram is a resident of village Babayacha in Ajmer(Rajasthan). At present, Nathi Devi is a member of the Women Self Help Group operating at the village level and is also an officer of the cluster at the Gram Panchayat level. Nathi Devi was associated with a self-help group about 10 years ago. There is total 6 members in Nathi Devi's family including husband and 4 children. Due to intoxication, her husband has no employment, she could hardly earn daily bread-butter for her family. The debt was also being raised and now no one was even ready to lend. RMKM officials went to the village and advised Nathi Devi to save by joining self-help groups. At first, Nathi Devi herself refused that she would not be able to save. When explained by the workers, she agreed to join the self-help group, started saving Rs. 50 per month. For small purposes, Nathi used to get an internal loan from the group which she used to repay in easy installments. Initially, her husband also prevented her from joining the group, but when the organization workers and other members of the group counselled him, he not only agreed to send Nathi Devi to the group regularly but also stopped taking drugs. Gradually, he started going to the work under MGNREGA and also started helping in agricultural works. Nathi Devi also started working as laborer in Kishangarh Marble Industry and with the support of Loan facility from self-help group, started fancy store. After working as a laborer till noon, Nathi used to work in the shop. In this way, the income and savings of Nathi Devi started increasing significantly. She has also extended the stock in her shop with the loan amount, Nathi Devi also increased the goods in her shop, now her eldest son has started helping in the shop. She has done construction work of her house as well. All the children are being sent to school. Presently she is happy with her family. Nathi Devi believes that who she is today is because of her association with Self Help Groups as per timely guidance given by RMKM officials.

In the year 2012-14, she took admission in the 2-year course D.Ed. Special Education (MR) run by Sagar College under patronage of Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal and completed it with hard work and dedication. Further, she appeared in examination of REET 2018 conducted by the Education Department (Government of Rajasthan), and got selected as first level special teacher recruitments, in which Lalita was allotted home district Bhilwara. Along with her, more than 55 students, who have been educated by Sagar College, got selected as 3rd grade teacher and various other reputable institutions. Lalita is currently working as a teacher in Government Upper Primary School, Jawasiakheda, Bhilwara. Lalita's parents gave the first credit for her success to Sagar College (RMKM) and said, "After getting trained from experienced teachers in special education from here, our daughter got a government job, which we never even dreamed of, so we are much thankful always." Lalita is also very happy because after getting a job, the economic conditions of her family has improved much, she has become able support in her family's livelihood. Now, she has devoted herself towards education and training of Persons With Disability (PWDs) and their Inclusion in society. Being a special educator, she wants to support the children in her school and nearby areas. Also, she is motivating the youth and especially girls in rural areas to join this course for their bright future.

14th KILBIL (An Inclusive Fete) - 22nd August 2019 :

KILBIL is now well known to Ajmer city, as soon as the name comes, the image of Inclusive Children's fete gets imprinted on everyone's psyche. This fete is organized every year by Minu Manovikas Mandir Inclusive School Ajmer which is run under the patronage of Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal. KILBIL is been conducted by organization since last 14 years in which children of many other schools participated. On 22nd August 2019, RMKM conducted 14th Balmela that witnessed around 1500 children (both- CWSN and Non-disabled children) of more than 30 schools. The most important objective was sensitization of people towards the PWDs as well as rehabilitation & mainstreaming of the special children into the society. An inauguration ceremony & Ribbon cutting was done by the **Hon'ble Mr. Arvind Sengwa, Additional District Magistrate** and many other prominent personalities of Ajmer District marked their presence in an event. They all visited every corner of Fete, enjoyed games, enjoyed dances and also took part in Challenging Challenges that were specially meant to make non-disabled people realize about the difficulties faced by PWDs. The main attraction was games for the children. Children participated in different fun activities, dance and music. Winners of each program got attractive gifts. There was also held Lucky draw for the coupons that were distributed in the people for the purpose of fundraising for the welfare of PWDs. To make the visitors acquaint of the working areas of an organization, there was organized an exhibition in which the working of all the ongoing projects demonstrated through banners. RMKM officials introduced the visitors about working by organization in all key areas viz. Education, Health, Livelihood, Micro finance & Childline Collab.

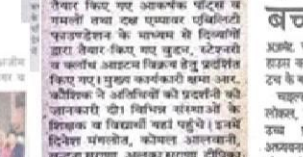


